The supporting information architecture that helps users find the **content frames!** 


# The Application Framework in a Browser Window





### Design Principles

- KISS: Keep It Simple
  - If you don't need it don't use it
  - Use simple web behaviors. Avoid complex dynamic html.
- Use the application framework
  - Develop unique functionalities not a unique framework
  - Don't create one-offs. Avoid custom UI for navigation, search, global function placement, etc.










# Workspace


Workspace

Tabs in the Header determine what is displayed in the workspace (sidebar and content area)



### **Actions and Tasks**


- Sidebar actions change the user current workflow, and generally represent primary tasks.
- Content area actions stay within the current workflow, and assist in the completion of the primary tasks. These can be thought of as 'subtasks'.



### Sidebar

The primary way users get to content and perform tasks.





### **Pinned Mode**







### **Unpinned Mode**







- Decreased discoverability
- Decreased learn-ability
- Increased burden on recall
- Left-most content is hidden

#### **Advantages**


- Increased way-finding
- Increased discoverability
- Increased learn-ability
- Decreased by burden on recall

#### Disadvantages

- Decreased horizontal space for data
- Right-most content is hidden

### **Behavior of Panels**





Scrollbars must **not** appear in the body of a panel.


Sidebar

Click anywhere on the panel header to expand or collapse panel

The panel body expands to display all of the information in the panel

The triangle icon indicates if a panel is open or closed





If complicated, can be displayed as a tree






Clicking on a destination selects the link and refreshes the content area


Clicking on a task may open a dialog (new window) or refresh the content area

Search results may open a dialog (new window) or refresh the content area


